Requirements:

The candidate should have a first-class or upper-second-class honours degree, or a master's degree (or equivalent qualification), in planning, human geography, social geography, economic geography, development studies, real estate, and social policy. Evidence of good spoken and written English is essential. The candidate should have an IELTS score of 6.5 or above (no subsection scores lower than 6.0) or other acceptable English qualifications, if the first language is not English. This position is open to all qualified candidates irrespective of nationality.

Degree:

The student will be awarded a PhD degree from the University of Liverpool (UK) upon successful completion of the program.

Funding:

The PhD studentship is available for three years subject to satisfactory progress by the student. The award covers tuition fees for three years (currently equivalent to RMB 80,000 per annum) and provides a monthly stipend of 5,000 RMB as a contribution to living expenses. It also provides up to RMB 16,500 to allow participation at international conferences during the period of the award. It is a condition of the award that holders of XJTLU PhD scholarships carry out 300-500 hours of teaching assistance work per year. The scholarship holder is expected to carry out the major part of his or her



research at XJTLU in Suzhou, China. However, he or she is eligible for a research study visit to the University of Liverpool of up to six months, if this is required by the project.

Project Description:

This is a fully funded doctoral project that aims to explore the impact of imperfect land property rights (ILPR) on rural development. The role of secured land property rights (LPR) in economic development has been theorised and debated intensively. Questions of securing LPR for sustaining food production and rural development have gained increased political prominence corresponding to the United Nations' sustainable development goals. Conversely, academic discussion concerning imperfect land property rights (ILPR) on development is scarce, especially in rural areas in developing countries, where it is still unclear to what extent rural deprivation is linked to ILPR. Legally and institutionally ill-defined, ILPR has inevitably led to uncertainty and randomness in practice.

This project seeks to conceptualise the ILPR and how ILPR regimes affect rural development activities. The research will examine how actors and/or stakeholders (rural residents, local policymakers, and capital) manage their investment strategies and rural development activities corresponding to the ILPR regimes in the context of uneven spatial and temporal development conditions in rural China.
